## SPOTLIGHT ON THE MOHAVE COUNTY MOBILE HEALTH VEHICLE

When most people consider moving to Meadview, one of their concerns is what healthcare services are available locally. Supervisor Jean Bishop seriously considered the need for local healthcare when she selected the various projects to be financed by funds provided by the American Rescue Plan Act. The ARPA funds that were divided among the five Mohave County districts provided the means to purchase a mobile health vehicle that can bring healthcare services to rural communities in District 4.

A Mohave County Mobile Health Vehicle is a valued new service especially benefitting rural areas of the county like Meadview. It is self-sustaining and can provide services without needing community resources like electricity and water. It's equipped with a waiting room, bathroom, exam room and table. The unit was designed to provide an easy throughput with an entrance and exit. Unfortunately, due to its compact design, disability access was not possible. Those who are differently challenged, such as someone who uses a wheelchair, will receive services outside or nearby in an appropriate and private setting.

Mohave County Health Director Dr. Chad Kingsley says, "The mobile unit will be used to provide preventative and education focused healthcare. A nurse practitioner and medical assistant will staff it and will work to provide identified and needed services." ARPA funds will sustain the mobile unit for the next few years. When ARPA funding is complete, the health department will transition funding to saved and planned finances.

Dr. Kingsley points out that "residents of rural communities often need more time to seek healthcare due to the length and cost associated with travel." By providing increased access to healthcare, the Mohave County Department of Public Health is working to decrease the use of emergency rooms as urgent care facilities prevent and treat substance abuse and improve the health of county residents. The Mohave County mobile unit will work with other existing service providers, such as North Country Healthcare to increase coverage and availability by alternating days and weeks.

During the first few months of operation, the mobile unit staff will work with communities to identify needs and services. Some residents have already expressed their need for blood draws, prescriptions and primary health care. Additionally, the Department of Public Health will provide education for nutrition, mental and behavioral health and substance-abuse prevention. Once the mobile unit is established, the county will explore other options and services. The unit's team will email communities in the coming weeks with updates and schedules. Treasurer Tom O'Keefe read the Treasury Report for the period January 1—January 30. Secretary Adrienne O'Keefe read the minutes of the January 2023 meeting.

Luis also demonstrated how to use native plants, especially Joshua Trees, as a "GPS" by being able to determine what direction is North. 
## WELCOME OUR NEWEST COLUMNIST

## WILDERNESS COMMON SENSE

### How much is water worth?

The most important thing to take when you leave the house for an outing in the desert or mountains is water. The second is more water and the third is even more water! You can survive in the desert without almost anything else but you must have water. After all the years I've spent in the wilderness, I can count on one hand the number of times a fire was important for my survival but, I can't remember one time that water was not.

When I was in SAR there were many searches and/or rescues for someone who'd run out of water. Some made it, some didn't. A few years ago, the news reported that a group of fitness instructors from Kansas went hiking in the middle of summer in the Superstition Mountains near Phoenix. They were overcome by heat after just a couple of hours. If they'd had plenty of water, they could've kept hydrated and cool by dousing themselves. Instead, some had to be airlifted to medical help.

I always carry at least two water jugs. One to use on the hike out and one to get back to my vehicle. I think of the second jug like a reserve tank on a motorcycle. I use clear plastic liter-or-larger jugs that are able to withstand a strong blow. Don't want the jug to burst if I happen to fall on it like the thin 16-ounce water bottles carried by many.

What I really dislike are the Camelback water bladders carried in backpacks. Too many hikers I have rescued used this water system without a second jug. Because the Camelback doesn't have a "fuel" gauge, the hikers don't know how much water is left until they run out and are in trouble. Because I carry the jugs in my backpack, I have to take one out to get a drink and I know exactly how much water is left. This way I know when to turn back. Water is like fuel in the desert, without it, you won't get far.

On several occasions I tried telling hikers I ran across in the desert that they needed plenty of water. They usually shrugged me off. They would say they were testing their endurance or they'd hiked much farther "back home." The National Park Service, with the occasional help of Search and Rescue, were rescuing so many people that ran out of water on the trail to Arizona Hot Springs near Hoover Dam, that they close the trail in summer. Even though there are big signs at the trail-head alerting people of the need to take ample water, many start hiking with only a single 16-ounce water bottle.

A trick I use on a hike that goes in and out on the same trail is to stash a gallon jug near the trail after an especially hard part. On the hikes I've made into Havasupai Falls, I stashed a gallon of water per person at the bottom of the switchbacks, after approximately the first mile of hiking. On the way out, after hiking the flats and getting hot in the afternoon sun, that gallon comes in handy to splash water on necks and to take a big drink before starting the climb up the switchbacks.

I have seen bodies with bloodied hands from digging in the desert washes trying to get water and I can't think of a worse way to die. **How much would you pay for a drink of water if you're lost and dehydrated?**


