SPOTLIGHT ON THE 2023 MEADVIEW OKTOBERFEST

The original Oktoberfest was held in Munich as a festival to celebrate the wedding of King Ludwig I and Princess Therese on October 12, 1810. Eventually that wedding feast evolved to be a celebration of bountiful harvests. The Munich Oktoberfests are held from mid to late September until the first Sunday in October with about 6 million international and national visitors attending the festivities.

The Meadview Oktoberfest sponsored by the Meadview Area Chamber of Commerce is a long standing, popular Meadview tradition. This year's Oktoberfest will be on October 14 from 10:00 am—3:00 pm. With the cooler temperatures of fall, it is the perfect time to get out and enjoy the beautiful weather in a festival setting. Meadview area residents and visitors can look forward to visiting with friends and neighbors in the comfort of the large "Fun in the Sun" canopy.

The BoatHouse "overflow" parking lot will be in full party mode with vendor, non-profit and crafters booths and displays. You can sign up for a space at the Chamber office. Space fees are: \$20 for Non-Crafters, \$10 for Crafters and no charge for Non-Profits. Bud Mickle and Band will entertain you with music for listening and dancing.

Food and beverages are top priority at any festival. The Oktoberfest menu will feature Brats and Saurkraut and Pulled Pork Sandwiches served with potato salad, corn on the cob and a beverage. Two varieties of beer will be provided by Black Bridge Brewery and non-alcoholic beverages and water will also be available.

The popular log cutting contest will return with co-ed teams this year. Partner up with a spouse or friend to show off your log cutting skills and you may win a prize.

Raffles are always a fun part of Chamber festivals and the event volunteers are busy collecting many raffle prizes. The winner of this year's Grand Prize will have their choice of a special getaway. One is a stay in Williams with \$100 cash for gas and the other one is 50,000 Alaska Airmiles donated by Sharon Baur. That amount of Airmiles will pretty much get you anywhere in the US. Tickets can be purchased at the Chamber of Commerce, Fisherman's Landing, Outpost and on the day of the event.

WILDERNESS COMMON SENSE

Knowing limitations

How far can you run? How much weight can you lift? How far can you swim? Knowing these limitations can keep you out of trouble. If you run too far, you could have a heart attack. If you lift too much weight, your back might rebel and you'll have to make a trip to the chiropractor. I hope you get the picture of the kinds of limitations I'm presenting but why don't people know or pay attention to the limitation of vehicles and their own abilities during common life events? A large part of having wilderness common sense is knowing the limitations of what you can do and what your vehicle is capable of.

A two-wheel drive vehicle won't go very far over snow covered roads with any amount of inclination, uphill or down. Yet, during the last snow storm in Mohave County there were several accidents caused by two-wheel drive vehicles heading up the Hualapais so the kids could play in the snow.

Over the years, I, along with other SAR volunteers, manned Sheriff's Office roadblocks on Hualapai Mountain Road in freezing conditions to keep those in two-wheel drive vehicles and those without snow chains or aggressive tires from starting up the mountain. In the back of my mind was always the question; "Why don't people know their limitations and those of their vehicles?" "Why should I have to stand out in the cold because some think they can drive up to the snow in a sedan without chains and if they get in trouble, their first call is 911.

Having wilderness common sense is knowing what is possible and what isn't. During my time working as a geologist, I knew how many miles I could hike in the mountains and how many rock samples I could carry and still have enough energy to make it back to my vehicle. I had to. There was no one looking out for me, no one knew where I was and in the countries where I was working, there were no search groups to look for me if something happened. In those countries, each person is expected to look out for themselves with no 911. Self-reliance is expected; not an option.

Unfortunately, there have been several examples of those not knowing their limitations with tragic results. The vehicle that was washed down Tonto Creek near the town of Gisela in Gila County and killing three children was a heartbreaking example. I'm quite familiar with that part of the state, having hiked and camped from Gisela to Hellsgate on Tonto Creek. This is steep rugged country with the potential for devastating flash floods. A cottonwood log 15-feet long and 4-feet in diameter jammed into a small crack in the canyon wall 20-feet above ground level demonstrated to me the raw power of flash floods in this area. Those who venture out in these areas must have respect for the power of nature and know their own limitations. Attempting to cross water too deep or too fast for their vehicle is a recipe for disaster.

Trying to hike too far or over country that is too difficult for your physical ability or medical condition is just asking for trouble as well as taking roads that are above your skill level. A common mistake I've seen over the years is someone retiring to Mohave County, buying an ATV or Jeep and going out to run the toughest trail they can. This has sometimes resulted in a senseless death and body recovery or a rescue of a severely injured rider/driver. I've participated in both. My hope is that all who venture out on trails or backroads know their own limitations, the limitations of their vehicles and have a healthy respect of the potential hazards of outdoor recreation.

MOHAVE COUNTY CORNER

As your Mohave County Treasurer, I am excited to bring you news from my office.

Board of Supervisors Tax Deed Sale auctions, 2019 - 2023:

6,861 parcels sold at auction and returned to the tax roll.

\$6.7M in revenue was generated for Mohave County

\$1.8M in redemption payments received to bring accounts to "current" status.

Board of Supervisors Tax Deed Sale auction, 2023:

788 parcels were sent to auction.

689 parcels (87%) were sold

\$1.1M in revenue received.

Investments:

My office takes a conservative approach to investing County funds. Examples of asset allocations include investments held in AZ State Local Government Investment Pools (LGIP) and United States Treasury securities which are backed by the full faith and credit of the United States government. For fiscal-year 2023, pooled funds for school districts, fire districts, special districts and County funds received **\$9.6M** in investment interest! This is the **largest amount** of interest received by the County's pooled funds in any fiscal year!

One-Page Tax Statements:

For 2024, tax statements will be one-page with additional data and transparency. One-page statements save our tax-payers up to 30% on postage and paper costs (and saves trees).

E-Check:

By working directly with our credit card vendor, Point & Pay, I have reduced the cost of E-Checks by 50%! Those savings go directly to our customers using this vendor to create E-Checks to pay their property taxes.

In the coming months I will be working with our state legislators to pass common-sense legislation that supports you, the taxpayer, and meets the needs of local government. I look forward to serving you, the residents of Mohave County, for many years to come.

Reminder: Watch your mail or e-mail for your 2023 tax statement coming to you mid-September.




