## SPOTLIGHT ON CELEBRATING VETERANS DAY

World War I officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28, 1919. However, fighting ended seven months earlier when an armistice between the Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of “the war to end all wars.”

Veterans Day continues to be observed on November 11 regardless of what day of the week it falls. The observance of Veterans Day on November 11 not only preserves the historical significance of the date, but helps focus attention on the important purpose of Veterans Day. Celebrating Veterans Day is to honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.

In November 1919, President Wilson proclaimed November 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day. The original concept for the celebration was for a day to observe with parades, public meetings and a brief suspension of business beginning at 11:00 a.m. The significance of 11:00 am is further recognized because all Flag Raisings conducted at VFW posts are always at 11:00 am.

The Uniform Holiday Bill signed on June 28, 1968 was intended to ensure three-day weekends for Federal employees by celebrating four national holidays on Mondays: Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Veterans Day and Columbus Day. It was thought these extended weekends would encourage travel, recreational and cultural activities and stimulate greater industrial and commercial production. Many states did not agree with this decision and continued to celebrate the holidays on their original dates. The first Veterans Day under the new law was observed with much confusion on October 25, 1971. It was quite apparent that the commemoration of this day was a matter of historic and patriotic significance to a great number of our citizens. On September 20th, 1975, President Gerald Ford signed a bill restoring the annual observance of Veterans Day to its original date of November 11, beginning in 1978.

Patriotism has a high priority in Meadview. It has been reported that 30% of Meadview's population are veterans. Keep the importance of this day in your heart. Celebrate by attending the Flag Raising at the VFW at 11:00 am and fly the flag if you have one. Take the time to shake the hand of veterans you know and thank them for their service. It's a simple gesture, but means so much to those who gave so much. Happy Veterans Day to everyone.

## NOVEMBER COM MEETING REVIEW

President Jonathan Kiser called the meeting to order and led the audience of 62 in the Pledge of Allegiance. Jonathan introduced guests Paula and Luis Vega, Carrie Wolstal and Jean Bishop. Carrie introduced Bill of Dolan Springs Cactus Cleaners. They will be doing a cleanup of the desert around Dolan Springs on November 16.

Jonathan asked five people to tell what they were thankful for this year. Each participant received a token gift of a bag of popcorn.

Jonathan announced that all of the current COM Board will return for 2024. Anyone who is interested in being on the board, should contact any existing board member. The election for the 2024-2025 term will be held at the December meeting. COM will be doing their Litter Control pick up of Meadview Boulevard on November 16. Assisted by his wife, Ross wore a hat that was appropriate for all stages of his life from childhood to the present time. The hat pictured at the right was worn many times through Ross's story. At the conclusion of his program, Ross was presented with a quilt from COM made for him by the Red, White and Blue Quilters of Meadview.

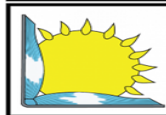

## Plot Study Results

Friends of Arizona



Joshua Tree Forest

Thanks to the volunteers who helped us gather data on our transplanted trees: Ernie Frey, Terri King, Alice Mazzella, Maryann Russell, Sharon Baur and Dolores Robb. We spent a couple of hours on October 16, 2023 measuring height, counting terminal buds and noting if each tree had bloomed. We also counted the trees that have died. The trees were grouped by when they were transplanted in the Mohave County project in 2020 or the Unisource project in 2022.

We are very encouraged by our initial review of the results! The first group was transplanted in 2020 and has a 40% survival rate with those surviving trees in good to excellent condition. The second group was transplanted in 2022 and has an 80% survival rate with those surviving trees also in good to excellent condition. We will probably see the 2022 survival rate decline in the next couple of years since we have seen that with the 2020 group. It seems we may have a good process developed for transplanting Joshua Trees.

All the trees we have transplanted had to be moved for a road project and our new power substation. We feel proud of giving them a chance to survive. We hope to partner again with a company with Joshua Trees that need to be moved from a property. About half of the Diamond Bar abandoned roadway was left to fill with transplanted Joshuas.
