SPOTLIGHT ON LEAP YEAR

The year 2024 is a leap year which occurs when the month of February has 29 days rather than the normal 28. The calculations that determined the need for adding leap days to the calendar was very complex and involved much more than just adding an extra day in February every four years with some exceptions.

Who came up with the concept of leap year? When Julius Caesar ruled the Roman Empire, it was discovered there were major drifts with the many different calendars used throughout the vast empire. In 46 BC, Caesar introduced the Julian calendar that was purely solar and counted a year at 365.25 days. To account for the extra 1/4 day, once every four years an extra day was added. But they still didn't get it right because there were too many leap years.

The Julian calendar was used in the Western World until the late 16th century when Pope Gregory XIII felt another calendar was needed. The drift created by too many leap years was causing Easter to be later in the year over time. The pope was concerned that events related to Easter might bump up against pagan festivals, so he wanted Easter to remain in the spring. The solution was to eliminate some extra days accumulated with the Julian calendar and establish rules of when there should or shouldn't be a leap year.

The pope and his advisors used complex math to give us the Gregorian Calendar in use today. It was determined that the Earth's orbit around the sun is actually six hours longer than 365 days. Adding a leap day every four years made the calendar longer by more than 44 minutes. To remedy this, it was decreed that years divisible by 100 do not follow the four-year leap day rule, UNLESS they are also divisible by 400. Therefore, in the past 500 years there was no leap day in 1700, 1800 and 1900, but the year 2000 had one. Without these leap year exceptions, there would be an adverse impact on events such as planting crops and how the seasons align with the sun and moon. After a few hundred years, we would have summer in November and Christmas would be in summer.

How do those born on February 29 celebrate their birthdays? When filling out forms asking for a birthdate, most "leaplings" will use February 28 or March 1. Some governments require them to fill out forms declaring if their birthdate is to be on February 28 or March 1. In Anthony, Texas there is a celebration for those born on February 29.

There are Leap Year traditions such as February 29 being the day when women would "pop the marriage question" to men rather than the conventional method. In Greece, it is believed to be a bad omen to get engaged or married in a leap year. And in the United States since 1792, Presidential Elections are held every four years. All of these elections have been leap years except for 1800 and 1900.

DID YOU KNOW?

- 1. Your Lake Mohave Ranchos Fire District in Meadview has a functional station house with upgrades and repairs done regularly as funding allows, approved by the Board and accomplished by the Management of the LMRFD, and paid for by the taxpayers in the LMRFD.
- 2. You have functional fire apparatus and ambulance, upgraded regularly. You currently have LMRFD's newest fire en gine and one of the newer ambulances in your station, provided by taxpayers in the LMRFD.
- 3. You have functional communications with a direct 911 connection to Kingman Dispatch, up to date radios and phone system, provided by taxpayers in the LMRFD.
- 4. You have functional management, qualified personnel, including a Fire Chief who cares, who supports and encourages volunteers, with training and educational resources available to participants, provided by taxpayers in the LMRFD.
- 5. You have 17-22 days of coverage with 1 person on duty. That is not enough, but it is more than your tax base supports, provided by taxpayers in the LMRFD.

WHAT DO YOU NEED? VOLUNTEERS!

Your once great volunteer force got old and retired. Also, due to government regulations implemented since 2008 there are stricter requirements on volunteers than previously. You can find those requirements on the LMRFD website, along with applications and other information. https://www.lmrfd.org/ Fire Chief Tim Bonnee is very supportive of a volunteer force within the LMRFD, with regular trainings and opportunities for education and advancement for qualified individuals. **Dolan Springs currently has 5 fire volunteers. Meadview has 0.** That is a community effort that somebody in Meadview could organize to improve your service. Meadview would greatly benefit from a volunteer force within the community to utilize the support you receive from the taxpayers in the LMRFD.






