SPOTLIGHT ON THE AMERICAN RED CROSS

American Red Cross COM is pleased to announce our featured speakers for the September 4 COM Meeting will be staff members of the Northern Arizona and New Mexico Chapter of the American Red Cross. Dennis Preisser, Recruitment Specialist, Jeremy Sleeter, Community Disaster Program Manager and Henning Larsen, Executive Director will present an in-depth program that focuses on Community Disaster Preparedness. The Northern Arizona Chapter has recently been re-opened after being serviced through the Phoenix office.

When we think of disasters, hurricanes, tornedos or severe flooding come to mind. While we are not generally in danger of such storms, we can suffer as a community from disasters resulting from the extreme weather conditions that can occur during monsoon storm season. We certainly experienced disaster-like circumstances when the Meadview area was without power for four days after 19 power poles were taken down during a monsoon storm a few years ago. We realized how vulnerable we can be and the need to be prepared for emergency situations. Our aging population, remote location and limited road access all add to the risk of disaster conditions.

Forest fires are another form of disaster that we may experience. Our dry, hot climate, strong winds and abundance of vegetation adds to the risk of forest or brush fires. We also can be impacted when an major accident occurs on Highway 93 that requires response from Lake Mohave Ranchos Fire Department. And as a community, we need to be prepared to protect the Meadview area residents from suffering during any disaster.

Emergencies can happen anytime and no community is exempt from the horrific experience. The American Red Cross provides free preparedness education to help individuals, families, schools, businesses and community organizations build resilience before disaster strikes. The American Red Cross is focused on assisting communities that have been affected by disasters. They can also provide guidance on how to set up, staff and equip a community shelter. The MCA has been named as such a shelter and they are seeking grant funds to obtain a large generator to make this possible.

The presentation will definitely be informative and provide guidance on how we can survive a disaster as individuals and a community. There will also be collateral material and handouts available to pick up. Hope to see you all at the meeting.

GEOLOGIST AT LARGEDistinctive rock formations

There are many distinctive rock formations in Mohave County. The pioneers saw these formations and it reminded them of animals, people or other things so they named the formations for their appearance. The naming might not have anything to do with geology but the reason the formation appears the way it does, does.

Possibly one of the most famous formations is Elephant's Tooth near the town of Oatman. Sitting on the edge of an eroded caldera, this area has a complicated geologic history including a huge volcanic eruption that spewed large volumes of volcanic debris into the air and depositing volcanic tuffs and flows. These were then intruded by renewed activity that formed rhyolitic dikes, stocks and plugs.

One of these intrusive bodies, probably the hardened throat of a volcanic vent, formed a white colored rhyolitic rock that eroded into a white spire. I guess this white spire looked like an elephant's tooth to early pioneers so that's what they called it even though many said the proper name should've been Elephant's Tusk.

North of Oatman, next to Highway 68, is another spire of rhyolite. It is one of the most distinctive spires in the range that some call Finger Rock but the pioneers, being much more politically correct, called it Thumb Butte.

The reason these spires remain is that the surrounding rock is softer and erodes easily, leaving the straight-sided spires. Boundary Cone, south of Oatman is also an intrusive stock. It has a vertical north side and a steep south side. I am familiar with Boundary Cone because, during my Search and Rescue days, there was a rescue of a young man who fell while trying to "free climb" down the north side. We started the rescue late in the evening, lowering a rescuer using ropes to the crack where the climber had fallen. We had to spend a very cold and windy night on the top of Boundary Cone, wedged between rocks so that we wouldn't roll off the mountain. With daylight the next morning, the DPS helicopter was able to pick up the rescuer and climber safely off of the cliff. They probably didn't notice that the rhyolite was a silicic (lots of quartz) intrusion of fine-grained rhyolite.



At the northern end of the Cerbat Mountains are a distinctive looking group of rocks called the Cockscomb. Look to the east as you head to Las Vegas near Dolan Springs and you'll see a rugged looking feature on the crest of the range just to the north of Mount Tipton. This feature looks like the comb of a rooster, that rubber looking bare skin on the top of its head. These jagged rocks look completely different than the round looking metamorphic rocks to either side.

These distinctive looking rocks are of Miocene to Oligocene age - an erosional remnant of a wide spread eruption of volcanic rocks. These rocks were laid down in horizontal layers. Through geologic time, they were tilted and eroded. Ultimately, the beds were isolated as a remnant of a broader expanse of volcanic rocks at the top of a fault block mountain with the edges of the beds eroded into the jagged cliffs. Today they look out of place - jagged rocks in a mountain range of rounded metamorphic and granitic units.

Going over Coyote Pass heading toward Las Vegas is the Castlerock Bar. It gets its name from the rock formation on the ridge across the highway. The rocks are Precambrian aged granite that have eroded into a broad lower part topped by a smaller dome. The formation looks like a medieval castle so it's called Castle Rock. The popular Badger Spring hiking trail goes through the saddle uphill from Castle Rock. A manmade feature on the hillside above the bar is a rock painted white with a black nose. I have heard it's supposed to be a polar bear or a mountain goat. This is a stretch for me. If it was not painted, it would look like a rounded weathered granite boulder to me, but then I've never seen a polar bear in real life.

There are other distinctive rock formations in the area with colorful names that today aren't considered proper. Back in the day, Duval geologists renamed a distinctive rounded ridge with a black coating of iron and manganese oxides to Roper's Ridge because the pioneer's name for the ridge isn't acceptable in today's world and we wanted to honor Bill Roper, the Duval mine manager at Mineral Park. Other derogatory names still appear on USGS topographical maps – one that is near Temple Bar comes to mind. No doubt, this and others will eventually be changed.


