SPOTLIGHT ON THE MONSOON DISASTER OF 2025

dis-as-ter: noun: a sudden event, such as an accident or a natural catastrophe, that causes great damage or loss of life

Ironically, 30 hours after the American Red Cross addressed attendees at the September 4 COM meeting about ways to prepare for a disaster, a major disaster struck. At approximately 2:00 am Saturday morning, Meadview was hit by a powerful monsoon storm that brought heavy rainfall to the area creating flooding. Some areas recorded as much as 4" of rain. The heavy rainfall caused all the washes to swell and flow like raging rivers. Most of the east-west streets became rivers as well. The storm lasted a few hours, but the storm's rage is still felt by residents days later.

Residents woke up to no water and some power and telephone outages. The force of the water carried off boats and vehicles like they were toys. Existing washes widened as the banks were compromised and washed away. Flowing water always takes the path of least resistance and anything in its path is at risk of being swept away. The force of the water broke water lines all over town and water service had to be turned off so the damage could be determined.

Ron Raymond and Horacio Baca immediately started working on the monumental task of repairing water lines. Their progress was impacted in some areas because they couldn't get to the broken lines. Every day more sections of town are getting their water service restored. But this process has to be done slowly and carefully not to cause more breaks.

The monsoon storm is like the "Good, the Bad and the Ugly". The "bad" is dealing with the inconvenience of not having running water in our homes. It is like camping out in your home. The "ugly" is the devastation of personal property, roads and the landscape of Meadview. But the "good" far outweighs the bad and the ugly. The immediate response to calls for help was amazing. Truck loads of bottled water continue to be delivered and distributed by volunteers. Port-apotty stations have been set up at the MCA and the Barn Event Center. Bulk water was donated by individuals and organizations and LMRFD set up a "port-a-pool" for non-potable water distribution. Gallon containers were donated for folks who do not have the means of collecting bulk water. Meals were provided for the volunteers and water repair crew. People who had running water offered their homes to folks so they could shower and wash clothes. Every day water is being delivered by volunteers to people who can't get out. And after a long day of repairing water lines, Ron Raymond takes the time to post a daily update how the repairs are progressing.

Throughout this crisis, the "grit of Meadview" has been evident. We have always depended on volunteers to take the place of infra-structure. However, the generosity of the community and volunteers in a disaster shows what a special place Meadview truly is and we are fortunate to be able to call it home. Here is a big shout out to all the volunteers and folks who contributed, but especially to Ron and Horacio. Yes, you are doing your jobs, but you definitely are going over and beyond for the community



September Greetings from the Recorder's Office!

As we step into September, we welcome the changing seasons and the continued opportunity to serve the residents of Mohave County. This month, we're proud to share exciting updates from the Recorder's Office, including milestones in our digital services and ongoing efforts to make public records more accessible to all. Whether you're recording a document, researching proper-

ty information, or taking advantage of our alert system, we're here to assist you every step of the way.

The Recording Division continues to make significant progress in serving Mohave County residents with efficient and accessible property document services. Residents can conveniently view and request copies of recorded documents through our online self-service portal, available here: https://www.mohave.gov/departments/recorder/recording/.

Our Recorded Document Alert System recently marked its one-year anniversary! Launched in February 2024, this free tool allows residents to receive email notifications whenever a document is recorded in their name or associated with their property. In just six months, the number of users has grown from 600 to over 900 registered accounts—a strong indication of the community's interest in staying informed and protecting their property. You can sign up for this free alert system here: https://eaglerss.mohave.gov/web/fraudGuard/disclaimerPage.

Meanwhile, the office remains committed to expanding access to public records through its Historical Indexing initiative. This project involves organizing and digitizing older property-related documents, year by year—a labor-intensive but highly valuable process. The goal is to eventually make records dating back to 1972 available online, increasing transparency and convenience for all.

Voter Registration:

During non-election years, the Voter Registration Division shifts its efforts toward maintaining accurate voter rolls and conducting outreach to educate the public on voting procedures. Residents can meet the team and learn more about the voting process at upcoming community events, including Kingman's First Friday, the Mohave County Fair, and the Autism and Special Needs Family Fun Fair taking place this month.

As of July 1, 2025, Mohave County has 152,167 registered voters. Community members interested in staying informed about voter registration trends and other updates are encouraged to follow the office's official Facebook page: Mohave County AZ Voter Registration.

An issue dating back to voter registrations completed before 2005 through the Arizona Motor Vehicle Division was identified in September 2024, involving incomplete citizenship documentation. Approximately 4,500 voters in Mohave County were impacted. Over the past year, the Recorder's Office has been assisting affected individuals in submitting the necessary paperwork. While many have resolved the issue, around 2,320 voters still need to provide citizenship documentation. A second notice is being mailed to these individuals this month.
