ANNEXATION WORKSHOP

For Lake Mohave Ranchos Fire District
Thursday, September 25
10:00 am to 12 noon at the Barn Event Center in Meadview

Theodora Koeppen, Board Chair for LMRFD will explain the annexation process with discussion about the pros and cons of joining the fire district.

Items to be covered are:

How to know if your property is in the LMRFD? How to request to join the LMRFD? How to calculate your fire district tax? What is the Fire District Assistance Tax? Why join the Fire District?

The benefits of joining the fire district will be discussed in depth. The annexation process is complex, however the LMRFD board and personnel will walk you through the steps from the application to approval. They will be ready to answer any questions you may have about annexation.

The Community of Meadview benefits from fire district tax dollars in many ways. The fire station building is maintained with upgrades and repairs done on a regular basis as funding will allow. Fire apparatus and the ambulance is maintained and upgraded regularly. Communication is provided via an up-to-date system with a direct 911 connection to Kingman Dispatch. The Fire District operates with functional management of qualified personnel including a fire chief who supports and encourages volunteers with training and educational resources. Employment opportunities are available for qualified individuals. The fire station in Meadview averages 17-22 days of



service with one person on duty. Although this is not enough, it is more than the current tax base supports. Property annexations into the district will add to the current tax base and provide the funding necessary to add more service days at Station 43 in Meadview.

Please be sure to attend the Annexation Workshop to understand how specific properties can be annexed into the Lake Mohave Ranchos Fire District.

VFW ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIP CONTESTS



VFW Scholarships and Teacher of the Year applications must be turned in to the local participating VFW Post by midnight October 31, 2025.

Since 1947, the VFW has offered scholarship opportunities to youth to bring Patriotism into the Classroom.

The Voice of Democracy Scholarship is open to students in grades 9-12. Students may enter each year. The Voice of Democracy contest entry is a 3 to 5 minute original, recorded essay on the topic: "How Are You Showing Patriotism and Support For Our Country?" This is a NATIONAL Scholarship. GEOLOGIST AT LARGE- The Lesson of the Headframe By Luis Vega

I always wanted to be the first to see an outcrop in the hope that it would lead me to the discovery of a new mineral deposit. I thought that by going out the farthest into the most rugged terrain, it would give me the chance to be like the early prospectors and find something no one had recognized as a valuable mineral deposit. This way of working led me to a life of adventure in remote and challenging environments. Now in my sunset years, the adventure still draws me, but the body doesn't want to climb that mountain or chop through that jungle. I have gained a new perspective and I'm listening to the advice of many explorationists.

New rule number one: the best place to find mineral deposits is within sight of a headframe- that wood or metal structure above a mine shaft. This adage points out that many times ore deposits occur in clusters. The area where a deposit has been found is a good place to look for another one.

There are so many examples of new deposits being found near old ones that the list could fill a book, so I'll just point one out that strikes close to home. As a cub geologist working in north-central Nevada, I took a drive to the old, abandoned Getchel mine. I looked around, studied the rocks and collected specimens of the minerals realgar and orpiment. I felt very smart knowing that the minerals that I'd collected were indicator minerals for a gold deposit, but because the Getchel mine had been mined out in the 1930s, decided to look elsewhere for a new discovery. As the years went by, many geologists visited the Getchel mine. It was even one of the best places to take geology students to see Carlin-type gold deposit alteration and indicator minerals.

After working for some years, I returned to complete a master's degree and during the oral exam, the professor asked me to describe a rock specimen he'd kept hidden under the table until near the end of the exam. I completely amazed him by describing the rock, its alteration and indicator minerals. What really floored him was when I told him where it was from- the Getchel mine.

I was very proud of myself after passing my exams but twenty years later, I learned I wasn't as smart as I thought. A company doing exploration drilling a short distance from Getchel discovered a huge gold deposit that was completely buried by alluvium. I believe they have over 20 million ounces of gold reserves. All that gold, overlooked for years, was within view of a headframe.



Two other terms used by geologists to describe where they look for new deposits are "brown fields" and "green fields." Brown fields are areas that've been looked over by many companies and geologists but might deserve another look because of new theories or ideas. A new conceptual model could indicate where to drill or what commodity to look for. The Black Mountains of Mohave County would be called a brown field area because they've been explored for over 100 years but there are still new ideas and concepts to test. The old Arabian mine off Highway 68, is an example where new drilling is having positive results.

Green fields are new areas that've never been explored. Not many green fields left in the US. When I was working in South America, it was all green fields. There were no old drill roads or roads to old mines so access to an exploration target was by muleback or helicopter. There were outcrops that'd never felt the strike of a geology pick. I was in hog heaven, we even found new deposits which was the "icing on the cake" and made it all worthwhile. I felt like an early explorer. Although I didn't have to worry about certain dangers, there were times in Peru when the guerrillas of Sendero Luminoso (Shining Path) were in the neighborhood, so we had to take precautions.

Today, I do my exploration work within view of a headframe, in other words, where other deposits have been found. I study the geology, structure and alteration to try and identify new ideas. I also read geology journals to keep abreast of new concepts and theories. I learned my lesson from the oral exams. Sometimes I think there is so much to learn, I don't know what I don't know.


