IT'S OKTOBERFEST TIME!!

The first Oktoberfest or Wiesn was held in Munich in October, 1810 as a 5-day festival celebrating the October 12 wedding of Prince Regent Ludwig of Bavaria (later to become King Ludwig I) and Princess Therese of Saxe-Hildburghausen. The celebrations in the city center were already referred to as a "folk festival". The festival ended on October 17 with a horse race on a meadow outside the gates of Munich. This site was called Theresens-Wiese in honor of the bride and this is still the name of the Oktoberfest in Munich today. Although there were no beer tents or log cutting contests in 1810, a royal wedding was the birth of the Oktoberfest.

The year after the wedding, townspeople wanted more and the festival was on its way to becoming an annual event. The new organizers of the festival were the Bavarian Agricultural Association and it became a celebration of successful harvests. In 1813, the newly established Oktoberfest had to be cancelled because of the Napoleonic Wars. Through the years, it has been cancelled due to two world wars, a cholera outbreak and economic crises. The first bratwurst stalls were opened in 1881 and beer began to be served in glass mugs in 1892. Beer maids dressed in traditional dirndls are notorious for how many 1-liter mugs of beer they can carry on their trays. Each year, new records are set about the amount of beer consumed and in 2024, 7 million liters of beer were served. Today, the Munich Oktoberfest is the world's largest folk festival and draws about 6 million visitors annually.

Here in Meadview, the Meadview Area Chamber of Commerce sponsors an annual Oktoberfest. Through the years, the event has been held in six different locations. However, it now has a permanent home in the BoatHouse "overflow" parking lot. This year event will also host the 2nd annual Oktoberfest Car and Bike Show. The fun happens from 10:00 am and continues until 3:00 pm on October 26. There will be lots of booths with non-profits, vendors and crafters.

It wouldn't be an Oktoberfest without Brats 'N Beer. The "Fun in the Sun" canopy will be set up where you can enjoy lunch, listen to live music of the David Parker and Friends Band or just relax with friends in shaded comfort. Be sure to purchase raffle tickets for many prizes and gift certificates. This year the Grand Prize is a 43" portable fire pit.

If you would like to volunteer to help with the set-up and break-down at the Oktoberfest, show up at the BoatHouse "overflow" parking lot. Please call the Chamber of Commerce to find out about set up times. Break down will be immediately at the close of the event. Booth spaces are still available and you can sign-up at the Meadview Area Chamber of Commerce office.

Preserving the Past: The Birth of the Meadview History Museum

In 2024, a passionate group of local residents came together with a mission to preserve and share the rich and layered history of Meadview and its surrounding areas. Thus, the Meadview History Museum was born.

Recognizing that the stories of this region—from its prehistoric roots to its Native American heritage and pioneer legacy—deserved a wider audience, the group began collecting archival materials, oral histories and artifacts. Their efforts were soon rewarded with the generous donation of a building next to the Boathouse, which now serves as the museum's home and a hub for community engagement.

The museum continues to grow, holding regular meetings and working diligently toward securing its 501(c)(3) nonprofit status. This milestone will help expand its reach and deepen its impact.

Meadview's history is nothing short of extraordinary. Nestled beside the Grand Canyon, the area is part of a unique location within the Lake Mead National Recreation Area. Meadview borders the Grand Canyon National Park and is adjacent to the Grapevine Mesa Joshua Tree Forest—designated both a National Natural Landmark and an Area of Critical Environmental Concern (ACEC).

This land has witnessed millennia of transformation. It was once home to prehistoric animals and later inhabited by Native American tribes whose cultural footprints remain etched in the landscape. As pioneers journeyed westward, they followed the Colorado River bringing waves of settlers and miners whose stories shaped the region's modern identity.

The Meadview History Museum is committed to making this rich tapestry of history accessible to the public. The museum aims to illuminate the past and inspire future generations through exhibits, educational programs and community events.

Stay tuned for updates on our progress and come visit us to explore the legacy of Meadview! We are open on Fridays and Saturdays from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm.

VFW ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIP CONTESTS

VFW Scholarships and Teacher of the Year applications must be turned in to the local participating VFW Post by midnight October 31, 2025.

Since 1947, the VFW has offered scholarship opportunities to youth to bring Patriotism into the Classroom.

The Voice of Democracy Scholarship is open to students in grades 9-12. Students may enter each year. The Voice of Democracy contest entry is a 3 to 5 minute original, recorded essay on the topic: "How Are You Showing Patriotism and Support For Our Country?" This is a NATIONAL Scholarship. You do not have to be a member or related to a member. The first place winner from each state wins at least a scholarship of \$1,000. The winning National Essay now receives \$35,000.00.

Patriot's Pen Essay Contest is open to students in grades 6 - 8. Students may enter each year. The Patriot's Pen entry is a written, original 300 to 400 word essay on the topic: "How Are You Showing Patriotism and Support For Our Country?" This is a NATIONAL Scholarship. You do not have to be a member or related to a member to enter. The first place winner from each state will receive a minimum of \$500. The winning National Essay is awarded \$5,000.00.

Do you know an Educator who goes the extra mile teaching Citizenship, Civics, Patriotism, Flag Etiquette in and out of the classroom? There are three categories for the VFW Teacher of the Year- Elementary, Middle and High School Educators. Our Instructors deserve recognition. The Instructor does not have to be a member or related to a member.

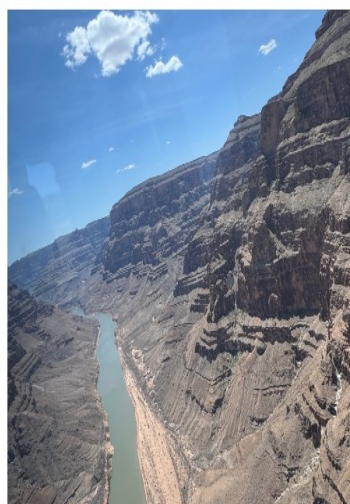

COUNTY CORNER

What does the County Treasurer's Office really do?

Sure, we collect property taxes—but that's just the beginning. Think of the Treasurer's Office as the financial engine of the county that plays a pivotal role in ensuring that vital revenue flows into the county's coffers to fund law enforcement, infrastructure, schools and a multitude of county government services. With every dollar that flows into county departments touching our office, we work as the county's bank, managing public funds with precision and purpose. We operate in a powerful 4-part cycle:

Billing – We provide property tax notice to over 260,000 accounts. Delinquent tax notices are also mailed out each December and June.

Collections – For tax year 2024, we received over \$220 million in property tax payments ensuring those funds were collected efficiently and securely.

Disbursements – Once funds are received, we disburse those funds to the appropriate local districts and County government services.

Investments – Guided by strict policies that prioritize safety, liquidity, and yield, we do not just hold money; we help grow it by responsibly investing public funds to provide additional financial resources.

From tax billing to investment decisions, the Treasurer's Office is where financial stewardship meets public service. In total, over 500 accounts are tracked and managed. And since transparency matters, every month we provide a financial report to the public right on our website—so you can see exactly how your tax dollars are working for you. Your Treasurer's Office strives to be a model of fiscal responsibility and transparency.

It's that time of year again. Property tax bills were mailed out on October 1. Be sure to check your mailbox and plan ahead—on-time payments are needed to fund essential local services like public safety, roads, and schools.

Do you need to check your balance or make a payment? Visit the Treasurer website at www.mohave.gov for easy access to your account. We are here to help—because managing your taxes should be clear, convenient, and transparent.

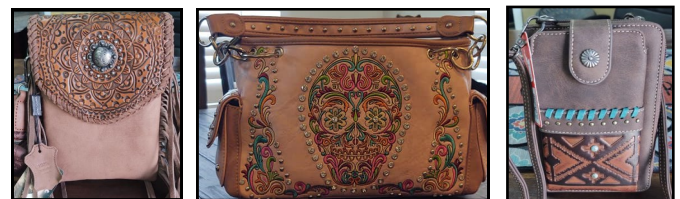

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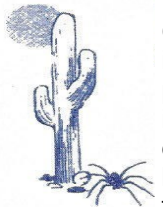

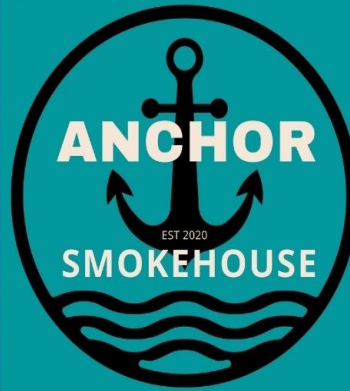
