SPOTLIGHT ON VETERANS DAY



Veterans Day is a U.S. legal holiday dedicated to American veterans of all wars that is celebrated on November 11. The date is important because in 1918 on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, an armistice or temporary cessation of hostilities was declared between the Allied Nations and Germany in WWI, then known as the "Great War".

In November, 1919, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed November 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day in the United States. Celebrations included parades and public gatherings, as well as a brief pause in business and school activities at 11:00 am. The original purpose of the holiday was to commemorate the end of World War I the prior year.

On May 13, 1938, an act was passed to make November 11 a legal Federal holiday "dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be hereafter celebrated and known as Armistice Day". In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War, Armistice Day became known as Veterans Day. Then in 1968 when Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, Veterans Day was included with others to be celebrated on a Monday. Veterans Day was set to be the last Monday in October which was not accepted by many states or the people. In 1975, after it became evident that the actual date of Veterans Day carried historic and patriotic significance, President Gerald Ford signed a new law returning observance of Veterans Day to November 11. The only time this would differ is if November 11 is on a Saturday, then the holiday is observed on the Friday before. If it falls on a Sunday, Monday is recognized as the Federal Holiday.

Veterans Day is very different from Memorial Day. The purpose of Memorial Day is to honor all who served and gave their lives for our country. Veterans Day is celebrated to honor ALL veterans, both living and dead, who served in times of war and peace.

This year on November 10, our local veterans will dress in their uniform or service branch colors and will be heading to Mt. Tipton School for a special event: Breakfast with a Veteran. There will be a celebration following the breakfast to honor their service. If you want to participate in this event, please call (928) 767-3350 to RSVP. There will be a flag raising ceremony at our local VFW post on Tuesday, November 11 at 11:00 at the VFW.

ANTHONY'S SPORTS CORNER

The 2025 World Series was one of the best series I've seen in years. Congratulations to the LA Dodgers for winning a back-to-back Championship. Game 3 went 18 innings and ended when Freddie Freeman hit a homerun. This is the 2nd time a World Series game has gone 18 innings. The first time was also Game 3 in 2018 when the LA Dodgers played against the Boston Red Sox. Ironically, Brad Paisley sang the National Anthem in both games. Here are some of the records that were broken in that game: 609 pitches, Shohei Ohtani reached the bases nine times, 37 runners left on bases, 25 position players used and 19 pitchers used. Game 7 was the most watched game ever with 25.98M people. This was the 5th time that Game 7 of a World Series has gone into extra innings. The Arizona Cardinals finally won a game yesterday on Monday Night Football against the Dallas Cowboys. With this win, our record is 3-5. The Arizona Cardinals play the Seattle Seahawks on November 9.

College football has been very exciting this year with upsets every weekend. Georgia is coming in at #5 this week, Miami coming in at #2, LSU is at #3, Penn State is #2 and Ohio State is still #1. 
