## SPOTLIGHT ON E.R.A.C.E. Environmental Rural Area Cleanup Enforcement

MISSION: To prevent illegal Wildcat Dumping by enforcement, education and the pursuit of Criminal Offenders. We accomplish this Mission by investigating the criminal complaints, educating the public with assistance from the many community volunteer groups, businesses and organizations throughout Mohave County.

The ERACE program was created to prevent illegal dumping and assure the rural areas of Mohave County are kept litter free. The agency is a division of the Public Works Department with full law enforcement authority to investigate reports of criminal dumping and apprehend the offenders. Todd Davison, ERACE Program Coordinator and three full time detectives work diligently with a team of volunteers to accomplish the task of keeping Mohave County pristine. The program is the only one of its kind in the country and is **NOT** funded with money from the General Fund.

In 2025, 286.3 tons of trash was collected and properly disposed of by ERACE personnel and volunteer groups across Mohave County. Meadview participates in the program through COM by working with ERACE to provide the volunteers and location of the annual community wide large bin cleanup. We are fortunate that Mohave County continues to provide the dumpsters to the community so this cleanup project may continue locally.

ERACE relies on reports of illegal dumping from members of the community. To report an illegal dumpsite or abandoned vehicle or watercraft, call (928) 715-0480. If you witness illegal dumping in progress, call the Mohave Sheriffs office at (928) 753-0753. Information regarding illegal dumpers pays off. For more information, see the notice on page 10 of this issue.

**How Can We Help?:** Don’t litter or dispose of trash on public lands and always use proper trash disposal methods. When hiking, carry a trash bag to collect any litter you may see. Help to educate people of all ages including our children not to litter. The ERACE program has training aids and lesson plans available to provide education to grade school students. Also, keep litter control bags in our vehicles and use them.

## GEOLOGIST AT LARGE- The World Needs More Prospectors

Returning from our prospecting travels, we finally heard some world news and learned about all the shooting and stabbings. What is going on? Why have so many young men given up on their futures? If they had hopes for a better life, would they do all these horrible things and throw away that future?

On those cold nights in our prospecting camps, I read books on the state of our world and was disappointed. Apparently, our young people are hooked on social media, TikTok and whatever else there is out there. This is all new to me because I don't have a Facebook account, can barely use e-mail and don't like to talk over the phone for more than five minutes. When we're prospecting, we seldom have cell service so no risk of spending time on the internet.

When I was working in South America, I wouldn't have contact with the outside world for weeks at a time. Making an international phone call to my wife would take half a day of waiting in line at the one and only international phone booth in the nearest village so I didn't call home very often.

My thinking was that if I'd just go over that next mountain or take that next sample, I'd hit the big one. The strike that would make the company I was working for a lot of money. It would bring jobs to a part of the world where there weren't any. The increased wealth creation would enable hospitals to be opened to service people that had never seen a doctor before.


When the company I was working for discovered and developed the Korri Kollo Mine in Bolivia, schools and hospitals were opened. There was also a small business development push so that, especially women, could start small businesses, develop some independence and diminish the scourge of spousal abuse. That was a lot of good resulting from the work prospectors did in discovering a very large gold deposit and I was part of it.

Today, even though we are retired, my wife and I prospect for our own financial benefit and to help rural areas develop jobs. It gives us a good feeling but it's hard work. Most of the time we find interesting geology but no mineralization so we move on to other areas. I once had a boss that told me: you have to kiss a lot of frogs to find a princess; in other words, you have to look at lots of areas before you find something of interest and then you have to sell the idea to a mining company and hope they can sell it to investors to raise money for drill-testing your idea.

That's a lot of if's. But a prospector must have a dream; the future will be better than the past. That he'll find that outcrop with stringers of gold if he just keeps climbing that mountain or the next mountain. If he gives up, he'll no longer be a prospector. The old timers would say that "he'd broken his pick."

We need more young men with the dreams of a prospector. Prospectors don't need Facebook accounts and don't rely on social media to tell them what the next fad is or what's the next cool thing to do. Although I do use the internet to learn where someone found a deposit and what the latest geologic theory is, otherwise, you're most likely to find me pounding on a rock, wearing hiking boots, jeans, T-shirt and a hat. Guess I wouldn't make it as an influencer on TikTok.

Having dreams doesn't just apply to prospecting but that's what I know best so I'll use the analogy. If more young men put down their phones and picked up a rock hammer looking for that strike, whether it's gold or something else, hopefully we wouldn't have all these shootings and stabbings. I think we would have more optimism in the world. The downside is that I would have more competition in finding that next deposit. But that's OK with me. I hope to see more young men and women in the hills following their dreams - just don't claim jump me if I find that strike first.

## THE COUNTY CORNER

The Mohave County Assessors office is anxious for 2026!

We anticipate many exciting changes this year. These changes are promising to make our office more efficient and effective or to make your values more precise and our services more streamline. Future County Corner articles will include much of the changes, this edition will concentrate on our Assessor programs that have application deadlines you need to be aware of.

### **DEADLINE: MARCH 2, 2026**

#### **Exemption Programs -**

##### **Widow/Widowers, 100% Disabled and 100% Disabled Veterans.**

Qualifications include income limits and property assessment limits. Qualifying income for 2025 may not exceed \$39,865 per household or \$47,826 per household with minor children. There is also a property valuation assessment limit of \$36,454 (FCV \$360,450).

Must be an Arizona resident.

##### **Veteran's Service connected 100% Disabled.**

Valid for Primary residents only and must be an Arizona Resident.

This newly created program was passed just months ago by our legislature. Unfortunately the law was written with much ambiguity. Qualifications are still not clear. The Assessors office should have clear guidelines from the state by March 1st. We ask for all Service Connected 100% Disabled to please file applications before the deadline, assuring inclusion. *Final details will follow.*

### **DEADLINE: SEPTEMBER 1, 2026**

#### **Senior Valuation Protection:**

Referred to as the Senior Freeze Program. This program freezes your values (it does not freeze your taxes). Qualifications include age; at least one of the homeowners must be 65 years of age at the time the application is filed. Valid for Primary residents only. Income limits are \$47,712 for individual owner and \$59,640 for two or more owners. Must reside in home for 2 years or longer. Must be an Arizona Resident

### **NO DEADLINE**

**Address Protection Program (AAPP):** This program is designed to reduce the potential fraud associated with deed transfers. The AAPP program ensures that the property owner is the only person who may change the ownership mailing address, avoiding ghost transfers. An easy to fill out notarized affidavit must be filed at our office; a Notary Public is available in our offices for this program. There is a \$50 fee for the AAPP program.

All offices below will be taking all above applications. Please bring your Arizona Drivers License. If you are a Veteran, Service or not Service Connected, a disability letter dated within the last 6 months is required. We look forward to seeing you.


