## SPOTLIGHT ON EMERGENCY SERVICES IN MEADVIEW

Last summer Meadview made national headlines when raging floods seriously damaged water lines and left parts of Meadview without water service for six days. As a result of this, we are now getting attention from local and national emergency management organizations that have acknowledged that we need trained and organized disaster teams.

We now have two official Meadview American Red Cross volunteers. One of these individuals only wants to work with local residents who need disaster assistance and the other will travel anywhere the Red Cross needs her. She is currently deployed to Houston, Texas where she has been working at one of 19 emergency shelters set up to provide care for those in danger due to the freezing temperatures that have hit that area. On January 22, the American Red Cross sponsored a five-hour Shelter Simulation class at the MCA. The training consisted of a 2-hour workshop followed by hands-on training in setting up an actual shelter to be used in a disaster. The room was divided into necessary areas that would be needed such as sleeping and eating. The American Red Cross provides cots and bedding.

On March 14, there will be a CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) class at the MCA from 9:00 am—3:00 pm. The class will be taught by Mike Browning, Emergency Management Manager. Emergency Management is a division of Public Works. We had an active CERT volunteer group here in the early 2000’s, but that was discontinued. The flooding disaster showed there is a definite need to re-establish CERT in Meadview. If you are interested in becoming a CERT volunteer or participate in the training, please send an email to [emsm@mohave.gov](mailto:emsm@mohave.gov) or call the MCA at (928) 564-2313 from 9:00 am—4:00 pm. There is more information about the training in the announcement on page 7.

The Phoenix Suns are in 6th place in the Western Conference with a record of 27-19. Not a bad year so far for them.



## GEOLOGIST AT LARGE- Nevada the Silver State, huh?

Nevada is known as the Silver State because of its history, but today they should change it to the Gold State. When pioneers first entered the state, prospectors discovered the rich silver mines of the Comstock Lode. Later the rich silver mines near Pioche were discovered and those of Tonopah and Austin. There were also some rich discoveries of gold such as Goldfields, Borealis and Delamar but most of the riches were from silver. These deposits were of the vein type with bonanza grades that were a promoter's dream. During these times Mark Twain came up with his famous saying "a gold mine is a hole in the ground with a liar on top."

Today, Nevada produces more gold than any other state in the Union. The total production in 2024 was 160 tons accounting for 70% of total US production. The majority of the gold came from Carlin-type deposits. These deposits were overlooked by the early pioneers because the gold is so fine that it can't be seen with the naked eye. They don't produce placer deposits, so you can't find them by panning in streams. The only way to detect them is to take samples and have them assayed.

Because the gold cannot be seen with the naked eye, promoters used this to "hoodwink" investors. They spun stories about having "colloidal gold" that can't be seen and can't be assayed using normal fire assay methods. The only way to test their "very rich" deposit was to use their propriety assay process. I ran into several promoters with no-see'um gold during my working days and spent many an evening at the local bar, as long as they kept buying beers, listening to their yarns about how I was going to miss a great opportunity by not optioning their properties. As far as I know, these properties are still for sale, if anyone's interested.

During the early days of the Carlin-type gold rush, starting in 1958, not much was understood about how they formed and where they might occur. This made exploration for new deposits a hit-or-miss game with many misses. Today, we know that deposits occur in belts with the Carlin and the Battle Mountain-Eureka belts being the best known.

The host-rock, the rock that contains the gold, is also important. It has to be a silty limestone full of sedimentary trash that increases permeability. These two factors are now considered important to finding new deposits; being in a mineral belt and lying in an area with the right host rocks.

Of course, there are other types of gold deposits such as those related to volcanic activity. There are both low-sulfidation (containing low amounts of pyrite) and high-sulfidation (containing lots of sulfides) hot spring types. One of the largest volcanic-type deposit is Round Mountain north of Tonopah, Nevada. This deposit occurs in a caldera; a large volcanic feature similar to the Yellowstone caldera. A large majority of these types of volcanic deposits are aligned along the Walker Lane, a belt of strongly broken and faulted rocks that lie in Nevada and parallels the Nevada- California border. In fact, the gold deposits in the Black Mountains are similar to those in the Walker Lane and many workers have projected the Walker Lane into Mohave County.

Unfortunately, Arizona is not as blessed with gold as Nevada. We are known more as a copper state with most of the large copper deposits occurring in the southeast part of the state. The mines at Bagdad and Mineral Park are exceptions, they are in the northwest part.

Prospectors are always optimistic and the fact that most of the gold is produced in Nevada has not stopped them from looking in Arizona. In Mohave County we have one producing mine, the Moss Mine near Bullhead and several advanced projects including the Arabian-Philadelphia (Au-Ag) off Hwy 68 near Bullhead City and the Cyclopic (Au-Ag) in the White Hills near Gold Basin.

The saying, "gold is where you find it", is true but you have a much better chance of finding it if you look in the Silver State of Nevada.

## KNOW ABOUT OUR NATIVE DESERT PLANTS

### Traditional Indigenous Uses of Native Desert Plants

For thousands of years, indigenous peoples of the Mojave Desert and surrounding Southwest developed deep knowledge of native plants. These plants were not only sources of food, medicine and materials, but were also woven into daily life, seasonal movement and cultural traditions. The plants featured in this article continue to reflect that long relationship between people and place.



#### Joshua Tree

Joshua Trees provided important raw materials rather than food. Strong leaves and fibrous trunks were used to make cordage, sandals, baskets, and tools. The roots and bark were sometimes used for soap and cleaning, while seeds could be roasted during times of scarcity.

#### Penstemon

Penstemon species were valued primarily for their medicinal qualities. Infusions made from leaves or roots were used in traditional healing practices, often for respiratory issues, wounds, or general wellness. The bright flowers also attracted pollinators important to the broader desert ecosystem.



#### Buckwheat

Native buckweheats were important seasonal food plants. Seeds were gathered, ground, and used as meal or mixed with other foods. Buckwheat flowers also supported insects that, in turn, supported birds and small game—making the plant valuable beyond direct human use.

#### Yucca

Yucca was one of the most versatile desert plants. Leaves were processed into strong fibers for rope, sandals, nets, and baskets. Roots were used as a natural soap and shampoo. Flowers and young stalks were sometimes cooked as food. Yucca remains a powerful example of sustainable plant use.



#### Honey Mesquite

Honey mesquite was a vital food source. Its sweet pods were ground into flour and used for cakes, drinks and porridge. The wood provided fuel and tools and shade trees served as gathering places. Mesquite supported both nutrition and community life.

### A Living Tradition

Today, these plants continue to support wildlife, stabilize soils, and connect modern communities to the deep history of this land. By learning about native plants and using them responsibly, we honor both the ecology of the desert and the knowledge of the people who lived with it for generations.
