DON’T BE A VICTIM OF A SCAM



With recent reports about scamming incidents in the Meadview area, Program Director, Karen Stacy asked that a member of the Mohave County Sheriff’s Office speak at the April COM Meeting. The Sheriff’s Office sent Lieutenant David Coffin who is in the Detective Division of the Mohave Sheriff’s Office. Lieutenant Coffin told us how to identify scams and how to protect ourselves from becoming a victim. He also told us that members of his own family were victims of scams.

One of the scams that is being worked in the Meadview area is the Jury Duty Scam. The targeted victim is called by an individual claiming to be a member of the Mohave County Sheriff’s Office. The caller tells the victim that there is an outstanding warrant for his arrest for not responding to a jury duty summons. The caller is very convincing and may tell the victim personal information such as birth date, address and names of associates. While all this information is public record, it can be unsettling to hear it from a stranger who claims to be a law enforcement officer. The intent is to try to make the caller appear to be legit. The caller tells the victim that he can avoid arrest by posting a \$500 bond, naming an actual bond company and saying the funds will be returned if you go to the Sheriff’s Office in 2 or 3 days. When the transfer fails, the caller tells the victim there was an internal problem and then offers other means of making payment such as purchasing gift cards to be sent to an email address provided by the caller.

Lieutenant Coffin told us that are some red flags in this scenario. Most importantly, the Mohave County Sheriff’s Office will NEVER ask for money over the phone. They also would not call you about an outstanding warrant for your arrest and offer a means to avoid arrent from taking place. But, the big red flag is offering an alternate means to make the payment when the “transfer link” to the bond company didn’t work. Law enforcement would never do that. Lieutenant Coffin said to end the call as soon as you suspect the caller is trying to scam you. If the caller thinks you are onto him, it is highly unlikely he will call back. If they claim to be from the sheriff’s office or a bank, simply hang up and call the number you know to be legitimate to verify if the call is authentic.

Should you realize you have become a victim of a scam, call your local law enforcement agency and file a report immediately. Contact your credit card company to stop the transaction. If it has gone through, filing a police report will increase the chances of recovering your funds. Incidents of telephone scamming are very hard to apprehend, because a lot of the calls originate in a foreign country.

To be on the safe side, always be suspicious of calls, texts, emails or mail containing threats, advising you that you owe money or have won a prize. NEVER give out personal or bank account information or send money via any method unless YOU initiated the contact with the person or company. Being suspicious is your best defense against becoming a victim of a scam or fraud.

COUNTY CORNER

As your Mohave County Treasurer, I am committed to keeping you informed about how we safeguard public funds and support the county's financial stability. Every resident deserves access to clear, reliable information about how their tax dollars are managed, and I appreciate the trust you place in this office. I am excited to share a few important updates on the work we are doing to continue improving the services you rely on.

Board of Supervisors Tax Deed Sale, 2019 - 2026:

- 10,477 severely delinquent parcels sold at auction and returned to the tax roll.
- Over **\$1MM** in property taxes received for parcels returned to the tax roll.
- **\$14.1MM** in revenue generated for Mohave County.
- **\$2.6MM** in redemption payments received to bring accounts to "current" status.

Board of Supervisors Tax Deed Sale, 2026:

- 809 parcels were sent to auction.
- 803 parcels (99%) were sold.
- **\$2.8MM** in revenue received.

Investments:

- My office takes a conservative approach to investing County funds.
- Examples of asset allocations include investments held in AZ State Local Government Investment Pools (LGIP) and United States Treasury securities which are backed by the full faith and credit of the United States government.
- For fiscal year 2026, school districts, fire districts, special districts, and County funds have received over **\$12MM** in investment income!

To make Treasury information easier for more residents to access, I am pleased to share that a link to a Spanish translation of the Treasurer's website is now available. The new pages include the same key information as the English site—property tax payment details, tax lien information, office hours, and contact options. This update was completed using existing resources, with no additional cost to the county. To view the Spanish site, visit the Treasurer's Office homepage and click "Español" in the menu. In the coming months I will be working with our state legislators to pass common-sense legislation that supports you, the taxpayer, and meets the needs of local government. I look forward to serving you, the residents of Mohave County, for many years to come.

Reminder: Watch your mail/e-mail for your 2026 tax statement coming to you early October.
