ARIZONA PRIMARY ELECTION 2026

The 2026 Arizona Primary Election is July 21. Primary Elections are held so each political party can choose the candidates that will be on the ballots for the General Election November 3. Arizona recognizes the following five political parties: Republican Party, Democratic Party, Libertarian Party, Green Party and the No Labels Party. Unfortunately, a lot of Americans skip the primaries and only vote in the general election. In doing so, they miss out on the opportunity to be part of the candidate selection process through voting.

The primary elections this year are midterms for Congressional, State and Judicial positions. In Arizona, the primary election will cover the U.S. House of Representatives, the governor and other key state offices, the 30 seats of the State Senate and the 90 seats of the State House of Representatives. Mohave County is LD30 and we will be selecting the candidates who will be on the general election ballots for the Arizona House and Senate as well as state and judicial positions.

To be eligible to vote in the Primary Election, voters needed to have been registered with Mohave County Elections Department by June 22. Early and mail-in ballots are available in the Primary Election with certain deadlines. The mail ballots were sent out on June 24 and early voting began on that date. The last date for early in-person voting is July 17. Early ballots must be received by the Elections Department by 7:00 pm on July 21. Ballots can be mailed (not recommended after July 14), dropped off at the Kingman Public Library or the Administration Building. Completed ballots can also be dropped off at any polling place on election day before 7:00 pm. You can track your ballot by going to trackmyballot.azsos.gov/voter. You can select the method of notice you want to use.

The polling place in Meadview is the MCA Auditorium located at 247 Meadview Boulevard. Polls are open from 6:00 am until 7:00 pm.

If you vote at the polling place, you must bring the proper ID from the following three options.

Option #1 is **one** photo ID including name and address from the following list: 1) Valid AZ driver's license, 2) valid AZ non-operating ID card, 3) tribal enrollment card or form of tribal ID, 4) valid US federal, state or local government issued ID.

Option #2: If a photo ID is not available, you must bring **2** of the following forms of ID bearing the name and address: utility bill dated 90 days of the election date, bank or credit union statement that is 90 days of the election date, valid AZ vehicle registration, Indian census card, property tax statement of the elector's residence, tribal enrollment card, recorder's certificate, valid US federal, state or local government issues ID including a voter's registration card.

Option #3 is a Mix and Match from lists #1 and #2 (two required). If the address from any ID in list #1 does not match the voter registration, another form of ID from list #2 is required. If a US Passport without address is used, one valid item from List #2 is needed. If a US Military ID without address and one valid item from List #2.

If you are unsure if your ID is acceptable, it would be a good idea to call (928) 753-0733 before heading to the polling place.

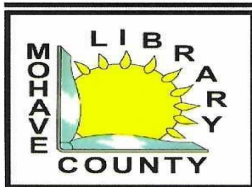

FACTS AND TRIVIA ABOUT VOTING IN THE USA



July 4th, 2026 marked the 250th anniversary of the United States of America as an independent democracy separate from Great Britain. Although the right to vote is the foundation of any democracy, there is no mention of the right to vote in the Constitution until July, 1868 when the 4th Amendment was adopted that addressed citizenship rights and equality. In the 1700's, voting was restricted to white male property owners.

Amendments 15, 23, 24 and 26 to the Constitution all assure that the voting rights of US citizens cannot be abridged on account of race, color, sex or age 18 and older.

Individual states decide how and when to register voters. Thirteen states allow voter registration on Election Day. Oregon is the first and only state to have "automatic" registration.

It was not until the 1890's that secret ballots become commonly used in America.

Only six states have bans on guns in polling places: Arizona, California, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana and Texas.

Sadly, the United States falls behind most developed nations in voter participation.

ANTHONY'S SPORTS CORNER

The 2026 FIFA World Cup is down to two teams: Spain vs. Argentina. The final game will be played in New York New Jersey MetLife Stadium on Sunday, July 19. You will be able to watch it at Anthony's Fisherman's Landing Bar. My prediction is that Argentina will take it all this World Cup. The Arizona Diamondbacks are in 2nd place in the NL West Division with a record of 49-47. They swept the Dodgers over the past weekend moving the Diamondbacks three games closer to the Dodgers. The LA Dodgers are in first place in the NL West Division with a record of 61-36. They were the first team to win 60 games. In the WNBA, Indiana Fever is in 5th place in the Western Conference with a record of 14-9.

THE COUNTY CORNER

Happy summer Mohave County!

I am excited to announce Mohave County's new policy regarding Short-Term Rentals (STRs). Short-Term Rentals are homes that are rented to guests for fewer than 30 consecutive days at a time, similar to motels and hotels. Mohave County currently has approximately 3,500 Short Term rentals with the majority of them in Lake Havasu City.

Mohave County's new policy establishes commercial classification for properties that are primarily operated as full-time short-term rentals. Our policy conforms with the Arizona Department of Revenue (AZDOR) guideline, which states: "Real property in Arizona that is devoted to producing income for the owner is generally considered to be commercially used, is classified as Legal Class One" and also "Properties that are available for either short term or extended stay occupancy are considered to be used commercially and should be classified as Legal Class One". As your County Assessor, it is the responsibility of our office to assess property based on its current use. Homes that are primarily operated as year-round short-term rentals are being used in a commercial manner similar to motels and hotels.

Over the past year, the Mohave County Assessor's office has reclassified more than 900 short-term rentals from Residential to Commercial. We will continue making these changes until all full-time short-term rentals are classified appropriately. We verify a property's primary use through multiple sources, including listings on short-term rental platforms such as Airbnb and Vrbo, Residential Affidavit of Property Class Change form submitted by property owners, city STR license applications, advertisements, and other available information. Every classification change is carefully reviewed and confirmed to ensure the property is being used primarily as a short-term rental.

Mohave County is not changing the classification of owner-occupied primary residents, nor are we changing the classification of homeowners who rent their homes out during certain seasons, such as "snowbirds" while they are away. We are only changing the classification of properties that are primarily available as short-term rentals for most of the year, with rental periods of fewer than 30 days. This policy allows homeowners with a casita or guest house on their primary residence to remain classified as residential, provided the property's primary use remains residential.

If a property is reclassified as commercial, the assessment ratio will change from 10% to 15%, as required under Arizona law. This will result in an increase to the property's taxable value for those properties that are primarily commercial in nature. This policy creates fairness by ensuring that year-round short-term rentals are classified consistently with motels and hotels that have long been assessed under the commercial classification.

As your Assessor, I take an oath to administer property valuation and classification "fairly and equitably", and I take that oath very seriously. As short-term rentals became more prevalent throughout our residential communities, we recognized that continuing to classify year-round STRs as residential was no longer equitable when motels and hotels providing the same type of lodging were being assessed commercially. This policy reflects our commitment to applying the law fairly and consistently across similar property uses.

As your Assessor, my goal is not to increase taxes. As a conservative, I believe it is important to keep taxes as low as possible while also ensuring fairness for every business operating in Mohave County. This new policy creates greater consistency in how similar properties are valued and classified. I also anticipate that other counties with significant numbers of short-term rentals will look to Mohave County as they evaluate their own policies. In fact, many counties from around the country have already reached out to learn more about our approach.

I encourage all property owners who rent their homes on either a part-time or full-time basis to complete our Residential Affidavit of Property Class Change form. Providing accurate information helps us maintain correct records and ensures your property is classified appropriately.

This form is available at our Assessor Office locations in Kingman, Lake Havasu City and Bullhead City or on the Mohave County Assessor's website under "Other Forms" at: <https://www.mohave.gov/media/krf15n24/residential-affidavit-of-property-class-change.pdf>

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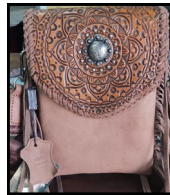
